

A day at Henry Fawcett following Government and Local Authority Guidance

Please observe start and end times for each class	These are staggered to avoid congestion at the gate.			
	Key Worker children 8.30am	Year 6 8.45am	Year 1 9.00am	EYFS 9.15am
Avoid travelling by public transport if you can. Parents and children line up outside school gates 2m apart at their allotted start time. Parents and pupils walk into school or playground, children stand on a marker on the pitch.		Parents exit using the pitch gate. Parents with children who are waiting for a different start time go to the waiting area by the stage/garden. Late arrivals will remain in the playground with their parents until a member of staff can collect them.		
REMEMBER	Only bring in your water bottle (already full and labelled).			
	You can bring in your packed lunch box if you do not have school dinners, but no bag.			
	You do not need your book bag or PE kit.			
	Try to wear clean uniform each day.			
ALWAYS	Observe Social distancing rules and follow the marker to help you			
ON ENTRY				
1st	Throw away any PPE you are wearing in the bin provided.			
2nd	Sanitise your hands in the playground.			
3rd	Wash your hands for 20 seconds as soon as you enter the school building			
IN SCHOOL				
BUBBLES	You will have 2 adults and up to 15 children in your group 'bubble' You will only be in a room with this group.			
TOILETS	Only one child in the toilet at a time			
HANDWASHING	You will wash your hands regularly throughout the day and always before coming back into the classroom			
IN CLASS	Tables are separated to help with safer relating, you will only sit in your allocated area. You will have your own pencil and resources. Soft toys, blankets, cushions and toys such as play-doh that are difficult to clean will have been removed from classrooms.			
CLASS WORK	You will work on the same tasks as your friends who stay at home using Parent Mail and Google Classrooms. You must bring any workbooks received in the post back to school on their first day of return. We will also work on emotional health and wellbeing, and be allowed time to socialise safely with your group. Your class teacher will support you from a distance.			
PLAY TIME	Your 'bubble' group will have a designated area to play in and will not share equipment with another group.			
LUNCH TIME	You will stay with their 'bubble' group for lunch. Everyone will eat packed lunch every day. These will be provided by school for children who receive free school meals, or those who choose to pay for them. You can choose to bring their own packed lunch.			

HOME TIME	<p>You will line up with your group and your parent/carer will promptly collect you. 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<h2>Frequently asked questions</h2>											
Will school be the same as usual?	<p>We have had to make lots of changes to the school to try to make it as safe as possible for children to return. This means that the school will look different, and routines and learning will not be the same. This will be explained to children and form part of the updated behaviour policy. Children will be supported by their teacher to follow the rules.</p> <p>Our Henry Fawcett values remain the same and we will still welcome everyone back into our school family.</p>										
Will my child have their usual Class Teacher?	Your child will have a teacher leading their ‘bubble’ group. This may not be their usual class teacher, but will be a member of Henry Fawcett staff. Some groups will also have a teaching assistant. The adults will be the same each day wherever possible.										
Will my child be able to play with their friends and enjoy themselves at school?	We want children to enjoy coming back to school and we will try to make their experience a positive one. The measures necessary to follow the government guidelines mean that children will not be able to interact and socialise with each other in quite the same way that they were used to previously.										
Will staff be wearing PPE?	We have been advised by the government that this is not necessary. If your child feels unwell or needs first aid, a first aider may need to put on PPE to treat your child.										
Can children wear PPE?	Government guidance states that it is not necessary for children to wear PPE. We ask for your child to dispose of any worn PPE as they come into school. We will not stop children from wearing face masks, but these will need to be clean and not worn for travel to school. Gloves will not be worn as they prevent effective handwashing.										
Will the school be clean?	<p>School has had a deep clean in April and a substantial clean in May to prepare for the opening following Covid-19 Government recommendations.</p> <p>A cleaner will be on site and mid-day clean, as well as end of day cleaners.</p> <p>Railings and door handles will be cleaned regularly.</p> <p>Classes have hand sanitizer and cleaning spray for regular use.</p> <p>Any shared resources will be cleaned before the next day.</p> <p>Additional cleaning will take place if there is a suspected or confirmed COVID-19 case at school.</p>										
Will social distancing actually happen?	All children and staff will be encouraged to stay 2m apart at all times. Our behaviour policy will change to reflect the importance of this new rule. However, it is important to be realistic about young children’s ability to follow this rule. We cannot guarantee that children will have no contact with others in their group.										
What should I do if I feel my child is unable to follow the social distancing measures?	Please speak to your child about the different ‘rules’ to keep safe that need to be followed in school. If your child has a learning or behavioural need that makes social distancing difficult for them, we will talk to you directly to plan for everyone’s safety.										
What will happen to my child if they do not	The school's current home school agreement is being adapted to cover these circumstances and will be applied to any incidents where a child's behaviour threatens their own										

follow the new measures?	safety or well-being or that of another child or member of staff. This will be shared and signed by parents and children.
What will happen if someone has symptoms of COVID-19?	<p>If a child displays symptoms of COVID-19, they will be placed in a quarantine room with a member of staff wearing PPE. We expect that they should be collected from school immediately and booked for a COVID-19 test. They can return following a negative test result, or a 2 week self-isolation if they cannot be tested.</p> <p>All other children and adults from the same group will also be asked to go home and self-isolate. If the case is confirmed, all group members must be tested before returning to school.</p> <p>If a child or family member develops symptoms at home, they should not attend school and must inform us immediately.</p>
Will there be a breakfast club?	School is only able to provide a core offer at present. There are no clubs including breakfast or after school clubs.
